Regent Home Tuition is designed to offer a unique and flexible programme with intensive language training for adults (18 years old and over). It is suitable for all ability levels from beginner to advanced. Students can start on any day and book as many days or weeks as they require.

Each course is tailor-made to suite the individual's goals whether they require a general, academic or business English course. Often the course will focus on improving fluency and communication skills, however this course is also suitable for adults who want to prepare for an exam or Pre-Sessional University course or English language examination such as Cambridge PET, FCE, CAE or CPE; Cambridge Business Exam (BEC); TOEFL, IELTS, or TOEIC.

Methodology

This programme of English lessons is designed to meet the needs of each student; we start with Diagnostic Activities, Tests and Needs Analysis to identify what the student can do, what they need to do, and what they would like to improve. This information is then used by the Home Tuition teacher to design an individual course. Every week during the course the student has a tutorial with the teacher. Each week the teacher writes a Study Record for the student to record what has been learnt. All students receive a report at the end of the course, stating their level and progress.

Between lessons the student is immersed in the natural English language of the teacher and family, because of this there are lots of opportunities to practise communicating in social situations and to improve cultural fluency. After lessons there are times for self-study, homework, and also for relaxing and absorbing the local culture.

Course Content

Our study programmes are carefully designed to help the student with their weaker points. The student will often use a course book, which provides continuity and revision opportunities. 1:1 Lessons can be built around the student's interests and hobbies, using TV programmes, newspapers, magazine and music as resources.

For courses focusing on business English, students can also practice some of the following:

- Using the telephone
- Writing emails
- Taking part in meetings
- Making presentations
- Negotiating
- Writing reports
- Using social English

Methodology

Sightseeing and Excursions

***London Museums and Attractions.** Combine learning English with an interest in places of cultural significance by visiting museums and other must-see attractions in the capital city.
