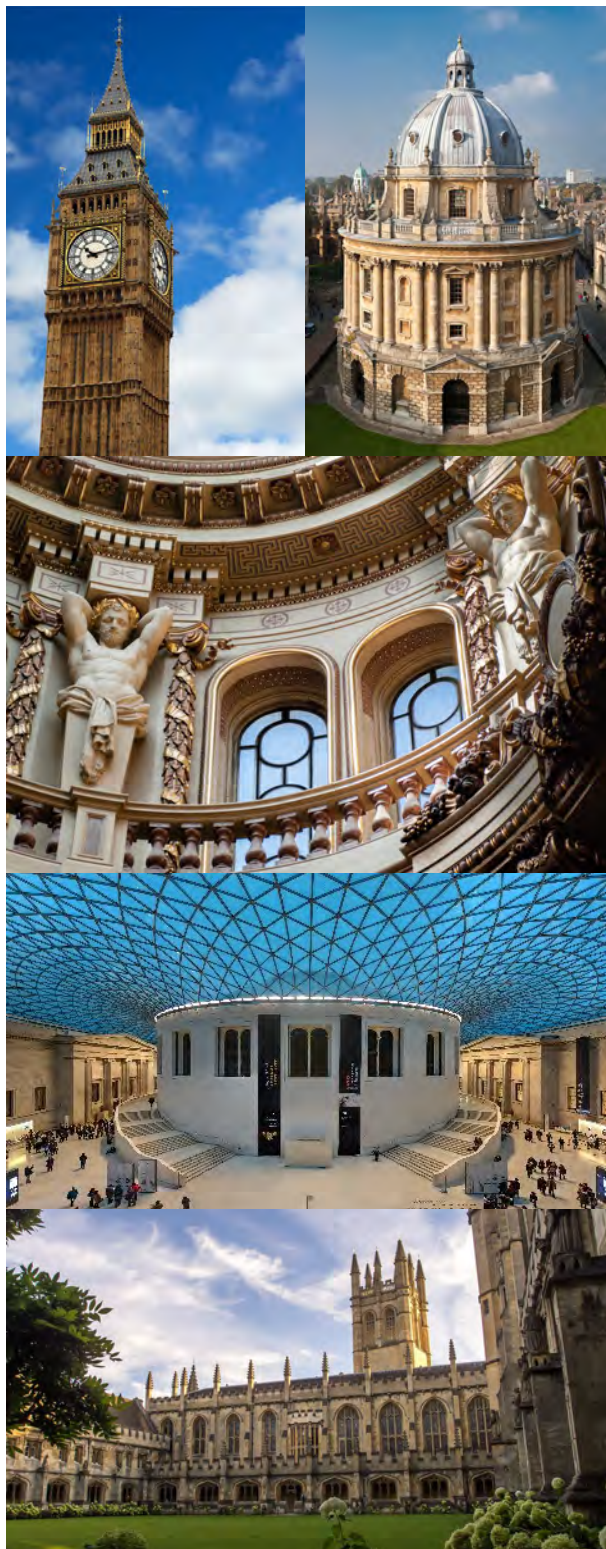

Oxford

Playing host to one of the oldest and most prestigious universities in the world and with buildings such as the Bridge of Sighs and the Radcliffe Camera, Oxford or 'the City of the Dreaming Spires', has a rich historical background. Oxford also has a strong literary tradition, inspiring authors such as C.S Lewis, Lewis Carroll and J.R.R Tolkein.

London

The capital city of England has long been regarded as one of the best cities to visit in the world. London is home to the Queen, Big Ben, the Houses of Parliament and countless tourist attractions. It is no wonder this diverse city has over 30 million visitors a year and was voted the Best Student City in 2018 by the BBC.

Cambridge

Abounding with exquisite architecture and steeped in history and tradition, the educational city of Cambridge is famed for its towering Gothic chapel as well as the infamous Trinity College- founded by Henry VIII. The various local museums also host a wealth of interesting arts and artefacts to discover.

Stratford-upon-Avon

This market town was built in 1196 on a medieval grid system and holds many historical and cultural treasures. In the 16th century the town was home to England's best playwright William Shakespeare. Today tourists still flock to visit his place of birth.
